BOARD OF FRANKLIN COUNTY COMMISSIONERS

Meeting Location: Franklin County Annex Building Commission Chambers

Chair Dunn called the study session to order at 8:30 a.m.

All Commissioners present except Commissioner Harris.

Dustin Browning, Community Corrections Director, discussed the FY2023 Juvenile Comprehensive Plan and Budget. The plan includes details on the district's plan to implement targeted risk reduction strategies in an effort to increase client success. He discussed that the Juvenile Board has some openings in Coffey County and Osage County. The budget represents a total of \$476,400.47 between Graduated Sanctions, Prevention, and JCAB-funded programs. This item will be on the agenda for May 4th for approval.

Dustin Browning, Community Corrections Director, discussed the FY2023 Adult Comprehensive Plan and budget. The plan details our current resources, programs, and objectives to meet evidence-based practices in FY2023. The Adult budget totals \$485,581.39 between ISP services and Behavioral Health services. This item will be on the agenda for May 4th for approval.

David Lee, Public Works Director, introduced Jeff Lolly with Bartlett and West to discuss the Old 50 Highway pre-design work that has been done. He discussed the process that was used to review the route like lidar mapping and physical review by driving the roads. Core samples were taken in 17 locations to verify the base that could be used. The proposed course of action is to reclaim a portion of the asphalt and use it to form a compacted base for the area to extend the roadway and a small paved shoulder. The next step would be to complete design plans for the project.

David Lee, Public Works Director, introduced Darron Ammond with Bartlett and West to give an overview of the Public Works Shops project. The project plan will be used as a future planning tool for the facility to manage and detain water, expand buildings in the future, and beautify the area while providing screening. The plan showed three water detention areas, one area that would require possible use of property owned by the Franklin County Fair Board. Changes to the recycle center drop-off process was also discussed to make the process easier for the recycle center employees and for citizens to drop off commodities. The next steps would be to have discussions with the City of Ottawa and the Franklin County Fair Board regarding the plan and items that need to be amended.

Brandon Sands, Facilities Director, discussed a request by Ottawa Family Physicians to expand the front of their office space to add an exit door to create better flow and add an additional room off the lobby for ultrasound and treadmills. OFP is ready to get bids on the project and need authorization from the Commission to make changes to the front façade of the building. This item will be on the agenda for May 4th for approval.

The meeting was adjourned at 10:39am.
