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


30-Day Alcohol Use

The percentage of students in grades 6, 8, 10, and 12 reporting any use of alcohol within the past 30 days (Percent data)




Two Week Binge Drinking

The percentage of students in grades 6, 8, 10, and 12 reporting having five or more drinks in a row on at least one occasion within past two weeks (Percent data)




30-Day Binge Drinking

The percentage of students in grades 6, 8, 10, and 12 reporting having five or more drinks on the same occasion at least once within past 30 days.




30-Day Vape Use

The percentage of students in grades 6, 8, 10, and 12 reporting any use of vaping products within the past 30 days (Percent data)




30-Day Marijuana Use


