

PROCLAMATION

13 - 04

National Tourism Week

May 4-12, 2013

Whereas, travel matters deeply to the economic prosperity of Kansas, as well as to business wealth and to comfort and pleasure of individual travelers; and

Whereas, tourism is responsible for creating 4.4 percent of the total Kansas Gross State Product and is the third largest industry in the state based on employment; and

Whereas, travel to and within Kansas provides significant economic benefits for the state, generating \$5.8 billion in economic output in 2011, with \$4.5 billion in direct benefit to core tourism industries while spurring an additional \$1.3 billion in economic enhancement to indirect industries;

Whereas, travel is among Kansas' largest private-sector employers, supporting 128,000 core industry jobs in 2011, an increase of 7.8 percent more than 2009; an additional 19,580 indirect jobs were supported by core tourism activity;

Whereas, travelers' spending generated \$14.4 percent of all Kansas state and local tax revenues resulting in a tourism tax contribution average of \$917 per Kansas household;

Whereas, leisure and business travel, taken in Kansas, spurs countless benefits to travelers' creativity, cultural awareness, education, happiness, productivity, relationships and wellness;

Whereas, travel is a catalyst that moves local, state, and national economies forward;

NOW, THEREFORE, the Board of Commissioners of Franklin County, Kansas, do hereby proclaim the week of May 4 through 12, 2013 as National Travel and Tourism Week in Kansas and urge the citizens of Franklin County to join in this special observance with appropriate events and commemoration.
