RESOLUTION NO. 14- 10

A RESOLUTION TO VACATE A PORTION OF JACKSON ROAD IN FRANKLIN COUNTY, KANSAS

WHEREAS, the Franklin County Commission authorized notice of proposed vacation of a portion of Jackson Road described as follows:

Beginning at a point nine hundred and three feet (903) East of the section corner at the Southwest Corner of Section 29, Township 17 South, Range 20 East, at the intersection of Nebraska Road and Jackson Road, thence East to a point one thousand four hundred and twenty feet (1,420) east of said section corner, in Sections 29 and 32, Township 17 South, Range 20 East of the 6th P.M., Franklin County Kansas.

WHEREAS, the Notice of Public Hearing was published in the official county newspaper on March 15, 2014, and

WHEREAS, notice of the proposed vacation was mailed by certified mail, return receipt requested, to all landowners of record as required by K.S.A. 68-102 notifying said landowners of the proposed vacation and of their right to protest said vacation; and,

WHEREAS, a hearing was held on March 26, 2014, for anyone wishing to protest the vacation of said particular road; and,

WHEREAS, as a result of that hearing, the Franklin County Commission voted to vacate the road.

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED
BY
THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF FRANKLIN COUNTY:

That the following road is not a public utility by reason of neglect, non-use, or inconvenience and that said road has become practically impassable and the necessity for said road as a public utility does not justify the expenditure of the necessary funds to repair said road or put the same in condition for public travel and therefore said road is hereby vacated as follows:

Beginning at a point nine hundred and three feet (903) East of the section corner at the Southwest Corner of Section 29, Township 17 South, Range 20 East, at the intersection of Nebraska Road and Jackson Road, thence East to a point one thousand four hundred and twenty feet (1,420) east of said section corner, in Sections 29 and 32, Township 17 South, Range 20 East of the 6th P.M., Franklin County Kansas.

This Resolution shall be in full force and effect following its passage by the Board of County Commissioners and its subsequent publication in the official county newspaper.

WHEREUPON, the Board of County Commissioners of Franklin County, Kansas, passes and adopts this Resolution in regular session, at its chambers in Ottawa, Franklin County, Kansas, this 26th day of March, 2014.
