Background: Ted McCurdy worked for Franklin County for 30 years in the EMS Department. During that time, he worked as an EMT then the Service Director for the Ambulance Department. When Ted started with the Ambulance service, it was located in the Basement of the Sheriff Department. In 1980 Franklin County built the ambulance station that is currently located on the corner of 14th and Cedar. Franklin County EMS expanded from a BLS to an ALS service in 2000. Throughout his time as director Ted strived to ensure that the Franklin County Citizens where offered the best care possible. In August of 2005, Ted McCurdy retired his position with Franklin County EMS. On December 20, 2007, Ted McCurdy passed away at his home in rural Ottawa. I feel that in honor of Ted's 30 years of dedicated service for Franklin County, his number 601 should be retired.

Recommended Action: Approve the retirement of EMS number 601 in honor of Ted McCurdy's years of service with Franklin County Kansas.

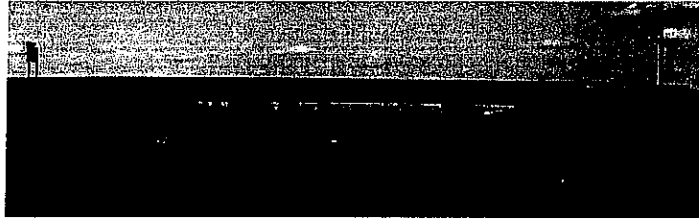

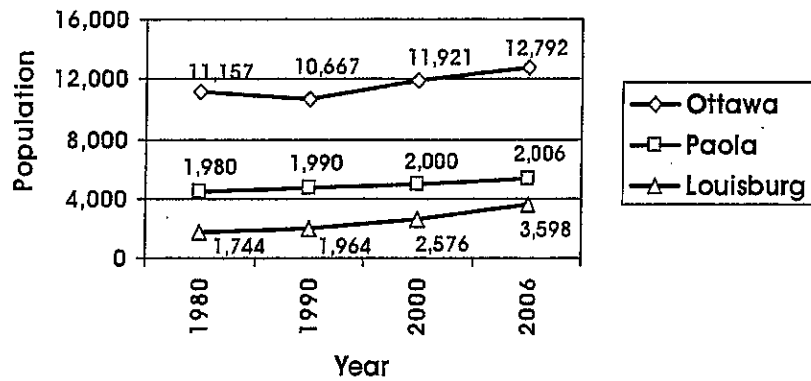

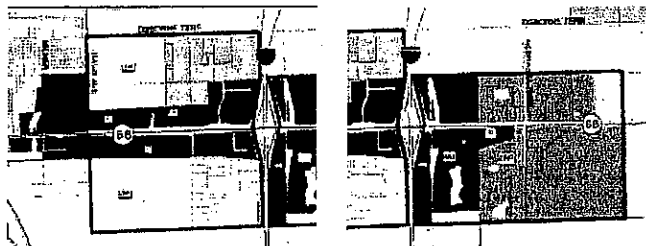

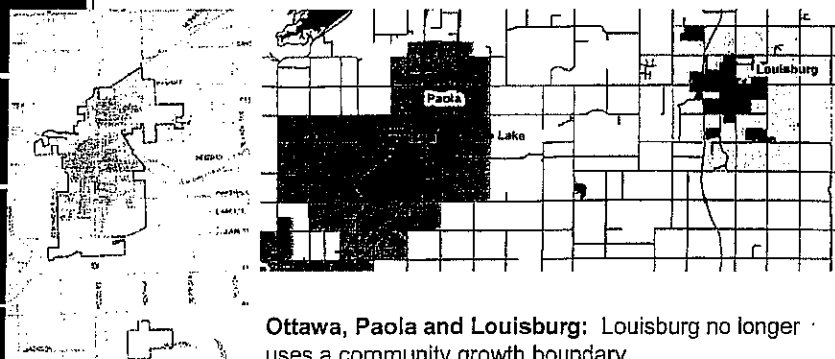


Ottawa: Commercial Center w/Access Control and Mixed Use Business Cluster

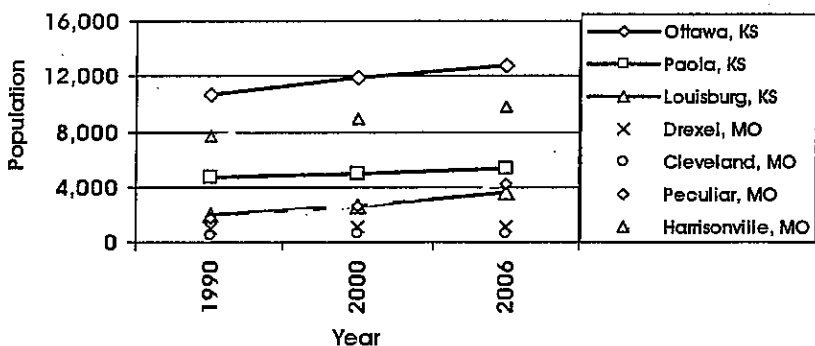

C O N T R A C T

THIS AGREEMENT, made and entered into this _____ day of _____,
20____, by and between _____ Franklin County Board of Commissioners _____,
First Party, hereinafter referred to as the OWNER and _____
_____ Beachner Construction Company, Inc. _____, Second Party, hereinafter
referred to as the CONTRACTOR.

WITNESSETH:

Article 1. It is hereby mutually agreed that for and in consideration of the sum or sums to be paid the Contractor by the Owner as set forth in the General Clauses, the said Contractor shall furnish all labor, equipment, accessories and material (except material salvaged or otherwise furnished as specified), and shall perform all work necessary to construct and complete the improvements in good, substantial and workmanlike manner, ready for use, and in strict accordance with the contract drawings and specifications as approved and filed pertinent to law in the office of the legal representative of the Owner.

Article 2. It is hereby further agreed, that in consideration of the faithful performance of the work by the Contractor, the Owner shall pay the Contractor the sum or sums due him by reason of said faithful performance of the work at stated intervals, in the amounts certified by the Engineer, in accordance with the provisions of the General Clauses, and as set forth in the proposal as accepted by the Owner.

Article 3. It is hereby further agreed that, at the completion of the work and its acceptance by the Owner, all sums due to the Contractor by reason of his faithful completion of the work, taking into consideration additions to or deductions from the contract price by reason of alterations or modifications to the original contract or by reason of "Force Account" work authorized under the contract in accordance with the provisions of the General Clauses, will be paid by the Owner to the Contractor within thirty (30) days after said completion and acceptance.

Article 4. It is hereby further agreed that the words "he" or "him" whenever used herein as referring to the Contractor, shall be deemed to refer to said Contractor whether a corporation, partnership or individual, and this Contract and all covenants and agreements thereof shall be binding upon and for the benefit of the heirs, executors, administrators, successors, and assigns of said Contractor.

Article 5. It is hereby further agreed that any reference herein to the "Contract" shall include all contract documents as specifically set out in the General Clauses and they are hereby made a part of this agreement as fully as if set out at length herein.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the First Party and the Second Party, respectively, have caused this agreement to be duly executed the day and year first herein written, all copies of which, to all intents and purposes, shall be considered as the original.
