### **ITEM:**

#### **Approval of the Kansas Department of Corrections (KDOC) – FY2008 Year End Outcome Report for the Fourth Judicial District Community Corrections**

#### Background:

After the end of each fiscal year the Fourth Judicial District Community Corrections is required to submit a Year End Outcome Report to KDOC. This report entitled Year End Outcomes for Fiscal-Year 2007, 2008 and 2009 documents the agency's progress toward meeting the objectives outlined in the agency's comprehensive plan. These objectives are unique to each judicial district and vary throughout the State of Kansas. The Fourth Judicial District Community Corrections met four of four, or 100% of the objectives in FY2008.

The report is due to KDOC on or before October 1, 2008.

## COMMUNITY CORRECTIONS YEAR-END OUTCOMES

Agency: Fourth Judicial District Community Corrections Fiscal Year: 2008

### ADULT INTENSIVE SUPERVISION:

**Objective #1: 97% of the offenders sentenced to AISP supervision (standard and SB 123) in FY2007 / FY2009 (each individual fiscal year) will be contacted by their assigned officer pursuant to the standards established by KDOC (2A-PRO-100)**

Outcome(s): During FY2008 a total of one hundred twelve (112) offenders were assigned / sentenced to AISP. Of those 112, one hundred twelve (112) or 100% were contacted by their assigned officer per KDOC standards. The objective was met.

**Objective #2: 98% of the offenders assigned to the AISP program in FY2007 / FY2009 (each individual fiscal year) that are eligible to receive referrals will be referred to resources to meet their needs (based on LSI-R data, criminal history, current offense, interview) within 30 days of assignment to the AISP program.**

Outcomes(s): During FY2008 a total of one hundred two (102) offenders were eligible to receive referrals to community based resources. Of those 102 offenders, one hundred two (102) or 100% were referred to resources within 30 days of assignment to the AISP program. The objective was met.

**Objective #3: 62% of the offenders terminated from the AISP program in FY2007 / FY2009 (each individual year) will be terminated successfully from the program.**

Outcome(s): During FY2008 a total of one hundred forty-seven (147) offenders were terminated / closed from AISP. Of those 147 cases, ninety-three (93), or 63% were successfully terminated. If you subtract the offenders that died or were not sentenced to community corrections (total of 6), the revised successful completion rate would be 66%. The objective was met.

**Objective #4: 40% of the offenders identified as absconders in the 4<sup>th</sup> Judicial District will be apprehended by law enforcement in FY2007 / FY2009 (each individual fiscal year)**

Outcome(s): During FY2008 a total of ninety-eight (98) offenders absconded from AISP supervision. Of those 98 offenders, sixty - (60), or 61% were apprehended by law enforcement. The objective was met.

During FY2008 a total of forty-three (43) offenders absconded from AISP supervision between July 1, 2007 and June 30, 2008. Of those 43 offenders, twenty-eight (28), or 65% were apprehended by law enforcement.

**Discussion:**

The Fourth Judicial District Community Corrections met objectives #1, #2, #3, and #4.
