

## STANDARD CONDITIONS OF PROBATION SUPERVISION IN THE FOURTH JUDICIAL DISTRICT

It is the order of the Court that you shall comply with the following general conditions of probation which go into effect the day of sentencing.

1. Obey all of the laws of the United States, the state of Kansas and any other jurisdiction to the laws of which you may be subject. If detained, questioned by a Law Enforcement Officer, or arrested for any reason, you shall notify your supervising officer within 48 hours.
2. Report to your supervising officer as directed. Complete required paperwork at all appointments or visits. If you fail to report, you shall contact and speak directly to your supervising officer within 48 hours to reschedule the missed appointment.
3. Pay all costs ordered on a schedule set out by your supervising officer. If you fail to make your scheduled payments, you may be required to complete the Budgeting/Financial Skills Class.
4. Provide your supervising officer with full and truthful information at all times and in all matters.
5. Obtain and work faithfully at suitable employment, in so far as possible, and support your dependants, if any. You are responsible for notifying your employer of the current conviction, offense, and length of probation.
6. Provide proof of address and/or employment when required to do so. Obtain your supervising officer's advice and guidance before changing address or place of employment. Notify your supervising officer within 48 hours if you lose your job and report progress in seeking a new job.
7. Do not engage in physical violence or threats of violence of any sort; avoid persons and/or places of disreputable or harmful character. Do not associate with anyone who is under the jurisdiction (on probation or parole) of the Federal Court or any State or Municipal Court for a criminal offense, unless prior approval is obtained from your supervising officer.
8. Permit your supervising officer and/or the surveillance officer to visit you at your home or elsewhere.
9. Remain within the area specified by your supervising officer. You shall not leave the State of Kansas without first receiving permission and/or a written travel permit from your supervising officer.
10. Do not possess, use or traffic in any controlled substance, narcotic or other drugs as defined by law, except as prescribed by a licensed medical practitioner. Do not possess or consume any alcohol or cereal malt beverage and do not enter into any establishment where alcohol is sold and/or consumed as a primary commodity.
11. Submit to breath, blood, saliva, or urine testing at the request of your supervising officer, the surveillance officer or any Law Enforcement Officer, at your own expense. Allow the results of any urinalysis or breath analysis tests conducted by your supervising officer or any Law Enforcement Officer to be entered into court as evidence, without the testimony of laboratory personnel.
12. Do not own or possess a firearm if subject to Kansas and/or Federal laws that forbid you from having a firearm.
13. Do not become involved as an informant for any Law Enforcement Agency.
14. All financial obligations and treatment, counseling and educational programs required, must be completed one month prior to the termination date of your probation unless the Court has ordered other deadlines.
15. Comply with any reasonable conditions, restrictions, or recommendations imposed by your supervising officer. Comply with all treatment, counseling and educational programs deemed necessary by your supervising officer and provide documentation of compliance.
16. Allow probation to be transferred to the county and/or state of residence and abide by any additional conditions imposed by the supervising agency.
17. Sign a waiver of extradition to the State of Kansas from any state of the United States and agree to not contest any effort by any state to return you to the State of Kansas.

The Court may at any time revoke your probation for cause, modify the conditions of probation, and reduce or extend the period of probation, as provided by law. The Court may issue a warrant for your arrest, or your supervising officer may arrest you without a warrant, for violation of any of the conditions of probation.

**In addition, you may have other special conditions of probation that the Judge has ordered. All of these conditions will be reviewed with you at your first appointment. Also, if you have not already returned your completed questionnaire, you must bring it with you to the first appointment. Call if you have any questions.**
